

Green Streets for urban trees

Canadian municipalities and aboriginal communities can submit proposals for innovative urban forestry project grants up to \$25,000. The deadline to apply for <u>Green Streets</u> is November 30, 2015.

The deadline to apply for <u>funding</u> is December 1, 2015.

Girls' Fund Grants, 2015-2016
