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



Learning to speak so others come first



opāskāhopīsim e nēhiyawēwin kayāsitotamowin pīsim -
miyawātamowin asici pīkiskwewinahk

Several Elders have told me that it takes about a year to develop a strong enough grasp of an indigenous language to speak it fluently - but the benefits of learning my indigenous language are immediate. The NGO Stabilization Fund provides special funding to help NGOs that deliver critical GNWT funded programs or services to the public to stabilize or develop their capacity to manage programs and services.

Support can be granted for eligible one-time general management, governance, organizational development, and extraordinary general operations costs related to the delivery of critical GNWT funded programs or services. Collaborative projects that build the capacity of more than one NGO are encouraged.
