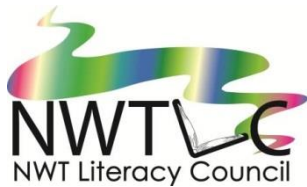

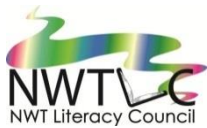

Apply to be our summer student

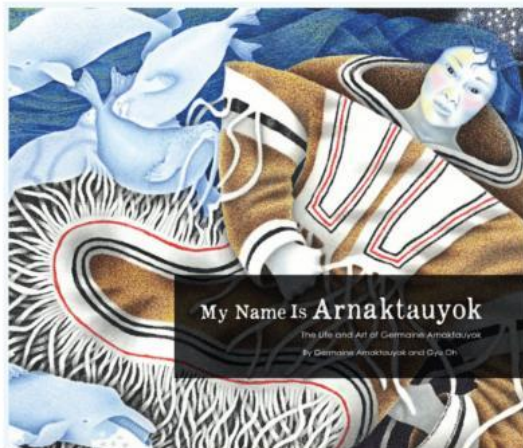
