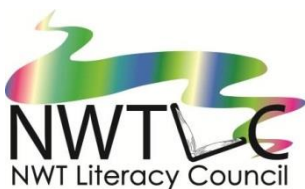

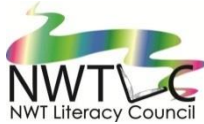

Funding to enhance participation of NWT women

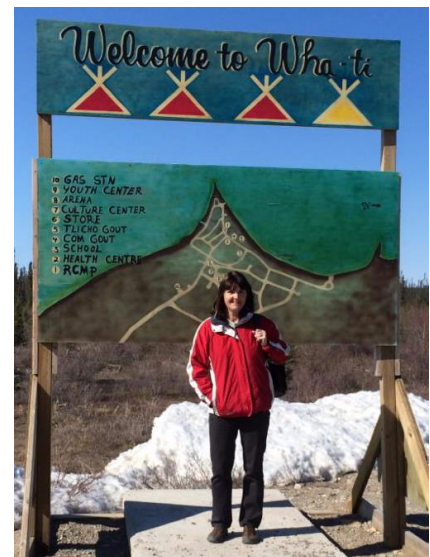
