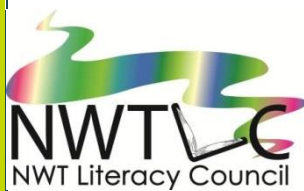
Embedding literacy: Halloween edition

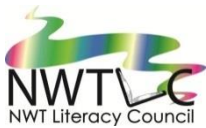

Green Streets for urban trees

Canadian municipalities and aboriginal communities can submit proposals for innovative urban forestry project grants up to \$25,000. The deadline to apply for [Green Streets](#) is November 30, 2015.

Girls' Fund Grants, 2015-2016

The Girls' Fund grants are intended to support community programs or networks designed to increase protective factors in girls aged 9 to 13 - such as confidence, critical thinking skills, social connectedness, and overall resilience. The deadline to apply for [grants](#) is December 2, 2015.

Training support for NWT volunteer groups

The [Volunteer Organization Development Contribution](#) provides funding for training events, workshops, courses, or other learning opportunities that help voluntary organizations and volunteers meet their goals and objectives. Non-profit volunteer organizations can apply for reimbursement of expenses to assist with fees and travel costs.
