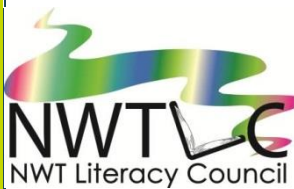

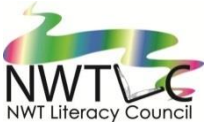

The [Yellowknife Community Foundation](#) has a number of scholarships available. Most of the deadlines are May 15, 2016, but check individual offerings. For example, the Friends of Fred Carmichael Scholarship for Beaufort Delta and Sahtu adult learners application deadline is April 22, 2016.
