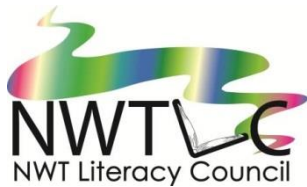

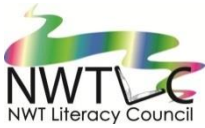
10 steps to your own little free library

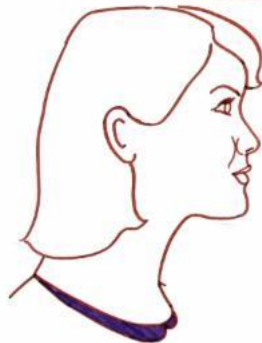
