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



Dene languages conference next week

The [Dene Languages Conference](#) is the world's most important annual conference for the study of Dene (Athabascan) languages, bringing together linguists, educators, language learners, and language activists from all parts of Denendeh and beyond. The conference is June 6 and 7 at the Explorer Hotel in Yellowknife.

June 10 is the deadline for literacy award nominations

June 17, 2016 is the deadline to apply to the [GNWT Anti-Poverty Fund](#). Up to \$500,000 will be allocated to initiatives aligned with the five pillars of the territorial Anti-Poverty Action Plan: Children and Family Support; Healthy Living and Reaching Our Potential; Safe and Affordable Housing; Sustainable Communities; and Integrated Continuum of Services.
