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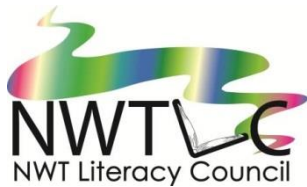

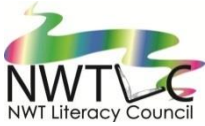
Can pooling resources give NWT mothers Finnish Baby Boxes?

The theme for this year's conference is "Language and History". The Yellowknives Dene First Nation is hosting the conference June 6-7, 2016.

Funding for arts and culture
