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





Indigenous Writer-in-Residence Fellowship

The [School for Advanced Research](#), in New Mexico, is seeking applicants for the Indigenous Writer-in-Residence fellowship. The fellowship runs from mid-June to early August and is open to writers indigenous to the United States or Canada. The fellow is provided with a \$6,000 stipend, on-campus housing, studio space, supplies allowance, library support, and travel reimbursement. The deadline to apply is February 16.
