

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

The symposium is hosted by the Alberta/NWT Chapter of the Canadian Evaluation Society, in collaboration with Dedats'eetsaa: the Tł'cho Research and Training Institute of the Tł'cho Government. It will highlight Indigenous approaches to evaluation with a special emphasis on land-based programming.

Inuvialuit fund education

The [Designated Amount Fund](#) accepts applications from organizations and individuals. It supports education to preserve and understand Inuvialuit culture, history and language, or to advance personal development. The deadline is July 13, 2018 for individuals.

Funding for non-profits

The [NGO Stabilization Fund](#) provides short-term support to NGOs who deliver critical GNWT-funded programs and services to NWT residents. Eligible one-time costs include general management, governance, organizational development, and extraordinary operations costs. The deadline to apply is May 11, 2018.
