You have until February 28 to apply to the <u>NWT Arts Council</u> for money to support your artistic project. The project can be in the visual, literary, media, and performing arts, or on issues and policies related to the arts and artists.

#### Language revitalization funding

The <u>Language Legacies</u> grant program supports documentation and revitalization efforts throughout the world. It is open to community members and researchers from any country. Grants are for one year and average around \$2,000 (US). The deadline to apply is March 15.
