Riz Khimji, Fort Providence

Reezwan (Riz) Khimji has served as Community Adult Educator working in Aurora College's Fort Providence Learning Centre for the past seven years and also serves on several College committees, including Professional Development, Math and Science.

Prior to his tenure in Fort Providence, he spent three years as Adult Educator in the community of Tuktoyaktuk. In 2002, Riz received a Bachelor of Science from McMaster University, after which he established an educational consulting company, Genius, Inc., to create individualized academic plans for students coping with various barriers to mainstream education. From this venture, Riz pursued one of his 'bucket list' items of exploring the Canadian Arctic, where the beautiful northern communities captured his heart.

His professional interests include adult education, business development, project management, and education and management consulting. Riz spends time writing funding proposals and building rapport with various levels of government focused on training and delivering educational and employment programs in the NWT.

Beyond the professional sphere, Riz also sits on the board of directors for the Zhahti Koe Friendship Centre, acts as an advisor for the Deh Gah Gotie band and is a member of the NWT Food Network. In his spare time, he trades Equities and Forex, is an avid traveller, enjoys snowmobiling and strives to learn new languages.
