

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



Apply now to build skills for youth

Funding for university preparation

The [University and College Entrance Preparation Program](#) assists First Nations and eligible Inuit students in university or college preparation programs. Contact your local or regional First Nations, Inuit, or Inuvialuit office for deadlines and more information.

Improve access in your community

The [Enabling Accessibility Fund](#) provides money for capital projects that increase access for people with disabilities in Canadian communities and workplaces. Projects should create more opportunities to participate in community activities, programs and services, or access employment. The deadline for small projects is July 26, 2018. The deadline for the youth leaders program is September 21, 2018.
