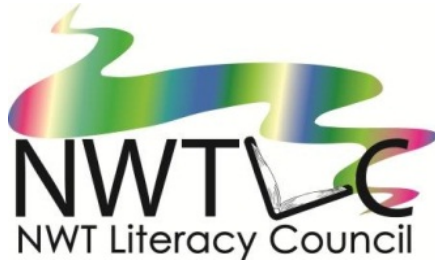

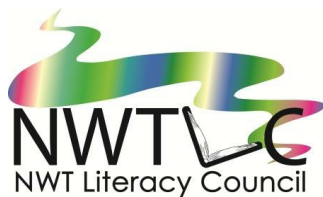

We're also plain language specialists.

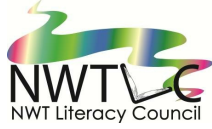

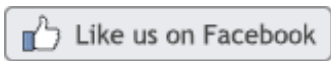
