

Funding

MEC Outdoor Nation

MEC Outdoor Nation's Leadership Council and delegates will be creating programs to inspire young people to get outside and be active at a stage in their lives when activity levels typically decrease substantially. MEC Outdoor Nation will launch with three inaugural weekend summits hosting 450 delegates between the ages of 18 to 27. The top three projects at each summit (as voted on by delegates) will receive funding from MEC. With \$30,000 in total project grants, MEC will help these committed young adults introduce new ideas, identify a generation of leaders and build community engagement.

Avon Foundation for Women

The <u>Avon Foundation for Women</u> will award a total of one million dollars to breast cancer charities. Ten grants of \$100,000 will be awarded to Canadian charitable organizations aiding and/or supporting those touched by breast cancer. Ten charities will be awarded funds in January 2015. To be considered for funding, Canadian breast cancer charities are invited to submit a proposal online by October 31, 2014.

Victims Week 2015 Funding

Through the Department of Justice Canada Victims Fund, limited financial assistance (up to \$10,000 per organization) is available each year for projects that support the goals of Victims Week. The key goal of Victims Week is to raise awareness about the issues facing victims of crime and about the services, assistance and laws in place to help victims and their families.
