



Anti-Poverty fund open for applications

The Government of the NWT set up a \$500,000 [Anti-Poverty Fund](#). The fund allows territorial stakeholders to work with the GNWT on tangible, concrete actions that reduce and eliminate poverty in the NWT. The deadline to apply is May 22, 2014.

Service learning grants available

The [State Farm Youth Advisory Board service-learning grant program](#) is now accepting applications. The grants range from \$25,000 - \$100,000 and are designed to create sustainable change in local communities across Canada and the United States. Public K-12, charter, higher education institutions, and nonprofit organizations are eligible, but must be able to demonstrate how they plan to impact student achievement within the public K-12 curriculum. The deadline to apply is May 2, 2014.
