Visiting author in the NWT for children's book week



Scholarships open for application

The <u>Yellowknife Community Foundation</u> has a variety of scholarships available for NWT students. Many of the scholarships have a May 15, 2017 deadline.

Field Law program open for applications

The <u>Field Law Community Fund Program</u> priority areas for funding are education, healthcare, at-risk youth, homelessness, women's organizations, community sports or arts and culture. The deadline to apply is May 8, 2017. You must register on their website to apply with
