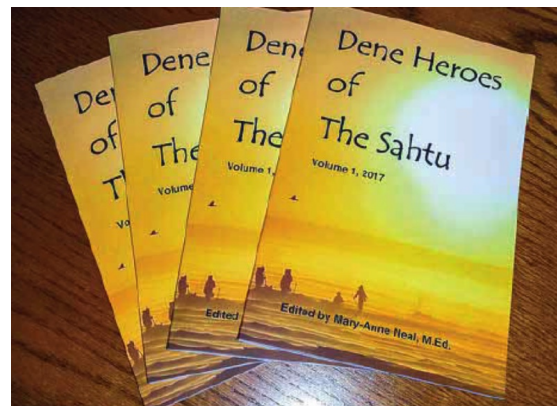
NWT Arts Council funding open
