## Funding

### Women for nature grant

[Nature Canada](#) has \$1,000 grants to support projects that celebrate the role of nature in Canadian culture and identity. This grant aims to encourage, foster and nurture youth (under 30) to demonstrate their leadership for nature. Interested applicants should submit either a two page essay or a short video. The deadline to apply is March 31, 2017.

### Funding for arts groups

The [NWT Arts Organizations Operating Funding](#) funds ongoing operations for established arts organizations and large annual NWT events and festivals. The deadline to apply is March 31, 2017.

### Help for victims of crime

The federal [Victims Fund](#) provides grants and contributions to promote access to justice, improve the capacity of service providers, foster referral networks, and increase awareness of services available to victims of crime and their families. There is no deadline to apply.

## News, Opinion, and Research

### Federal budget 2017 highlights

Finance Minister Bill Morneau tabled his second federal budget yesterday. It fleshes out details on the government's infrastructure spending and plans for innovation while avoiding major tax changes. Here are some highlights for northerners.

- \$14.7 million over three years starting in 2017-18 to extend and enhance the [Northern Adult Basic Education Program](#) (NABE) in the three northern territories. NABE is designed to provide targeted training so adults can participate more fully in the labour market.
- To help more low-income families benefit from the [Canada Learning Bond](#), \$12.5 million over six years, starting in 2017-18, for a pilot project. The project will explore new ways to reduce barriers to accessing this grant for children's post-secondary education.
- \$300-million over the next 11 years to build [housing in the northern territories](#).
- \$30 million a year to promote, preserve, and expand the use of [Indigenous languages](#). The budget also provides funding to develop "information technology to preserve oral histories by converting speech to text, and creating other interactive educational materials."
- \$25 million over five years, starting in 2017-18, to support a pilot [Indigenous Guardians Program](#).
