





Rick Hansen accessibility grants

Through the [Access4All Initiative](#) Canadians are encouraged to identify accessibility barriers in public places in their communities and apply for funding from the Rick Hansen Foundation to remove them. You can submit applications for up to \$30,000 in funding for a Barrier Buster project, which includes an accessibility infrastructure improvement and a related community awareness building event. Applications are assessed on an ongoing basis with a final deadline of March 31, 2017.
