



Funding for on the land programs

The [NWT On The Land Collaborative](#) wants communities,

The collaborative brings together government, charities, corporations, and other partners to make it easier for communities to access money and resources for on the land projects. The deadline to apply for funding is December 8, 2017.

Check for literacy development money in your region

The fund is administered through the regional Education, Culture and Employment Service Centres. There may be money left in your region for 2017-2018. This fund supports literacy development in all of the NWT official languages, with an emphasis on Indigenous languages.
