

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Workshop Overviews

Introduction to Family Literacy

The Introduction to Family Literacy workshop will explore the meaning of family literacy: how everyday activities such as cooking, making crafts and spending time together are literacy experiences for children. You will learn how to expand on these activities to incorporate them into your family literacy program.

Babies are Born Learning

We now know that the brain grows more in the first three years of life than at any other time. This workshop explains the connection between early childhood experiences, brain development, and lifelong learning and well-being. It will cover the basics of early childhood brain development, how children learn language, and how parents and caregivers can give the early care needed to build a strong foundation for life.

1-2-3 Rhyme with Me

1-2-3 Rhyme with Me is a fun, interactive rhyming and singing program for young children and their parents. Come and learn how to facilitate this program in your community. You will learn about brain development and oral language development, as well as many fun rhymes and songs to use in your program. You will receive a book and a CD of rhymes, stories and songs to take home.

Choosing Books

The *Choosing Books* workshop will explore different types of books and why we love them! Participants will have the opportunity to share their favorite books with others. We will explore why different styles of books are best for different ages and stages. You will learn how to read with enthusiasm and have fun with reading. Get set for some fun, hands-on book exploration.

Family Literacy Program Planning

This session will explore different ideas for family literacy programs, and ways you can partner with others in your community. We will discuss funding options, and the support that the NWTLC can provide to you.

Storytime Adventures

Storytime Adventures is a program for preschool children. Each session includes reading a story and doing a related craft, snack, game or other activity. After this workshop, you will be able to run a Storytime Adventures program in your community. You will receive a manual with ideas for 10 different Storytime Adventures to help you get started.

Take a Break

Take a Break is a brand family literacy and parenting program. This program gives parents a chance to relax and connect with other parents. They will be able to share parenting ideas, as well as learning new family literacy activities to do at home. We will do a sample *Take a Break* parent session, and you will receive a manual to help you run the program in your community.

Read the Rainbow

Read the Rainbow is a brand new NWTLC Family Literacy program. This resource includes activities paired with books with gender and sexuality diverse characters, authors and/or illustrators. This workshop will include a discussion on the importance of seeing diverse characters and hearing from diverse authors, as well as a sample session. After this workshop, you will be able to run a *Read the Rainbow* program in your community.

Special Guest sessions

We have partnered with Dad Central Ontario to help bring some of their father and male care-giver program trainings to the NWT. They will join us virtually during our Family Literacy Training Institute (FLTI), and then again online for everyone in January.

My Dad Matters

This workshop will take place during FLTI, with the Dad Central team joining us virtually.

The training goes through an action planning process which helps each trainee:

- assess their work with fathers;
- understand issues facing fathers;
- look at barriers to engaging fathers;
- review best practices for providing services & support;
- develop an action plan for reaching fathers in their community.

Super Dads, Super Kids

This workshop will take place online on Friday, January 13, 9 am to 12 pm Mountain time. All participants from FLTI will be invited to join this session. Workshop description from Dad Central:

Are you looking for an evidence based, simple to run, and low resource program that significantly supports dads engagement with their children? Then think of Super Dads, Super Kids (SDSK) as your plug and play solution for engaging dads. All you need to run an in-person or virtual program is included.

The Facilitator Training provides the research background, fatherhood insights, and key facilitation practices that will bring the eight modules to life for all facilitators. Whether a seasoned facilitator, or brand new to working with dads, this training gives you the confidence, knowledge, and support needed to run SDSK effectively.
