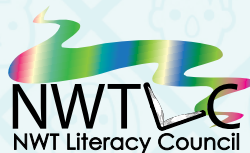

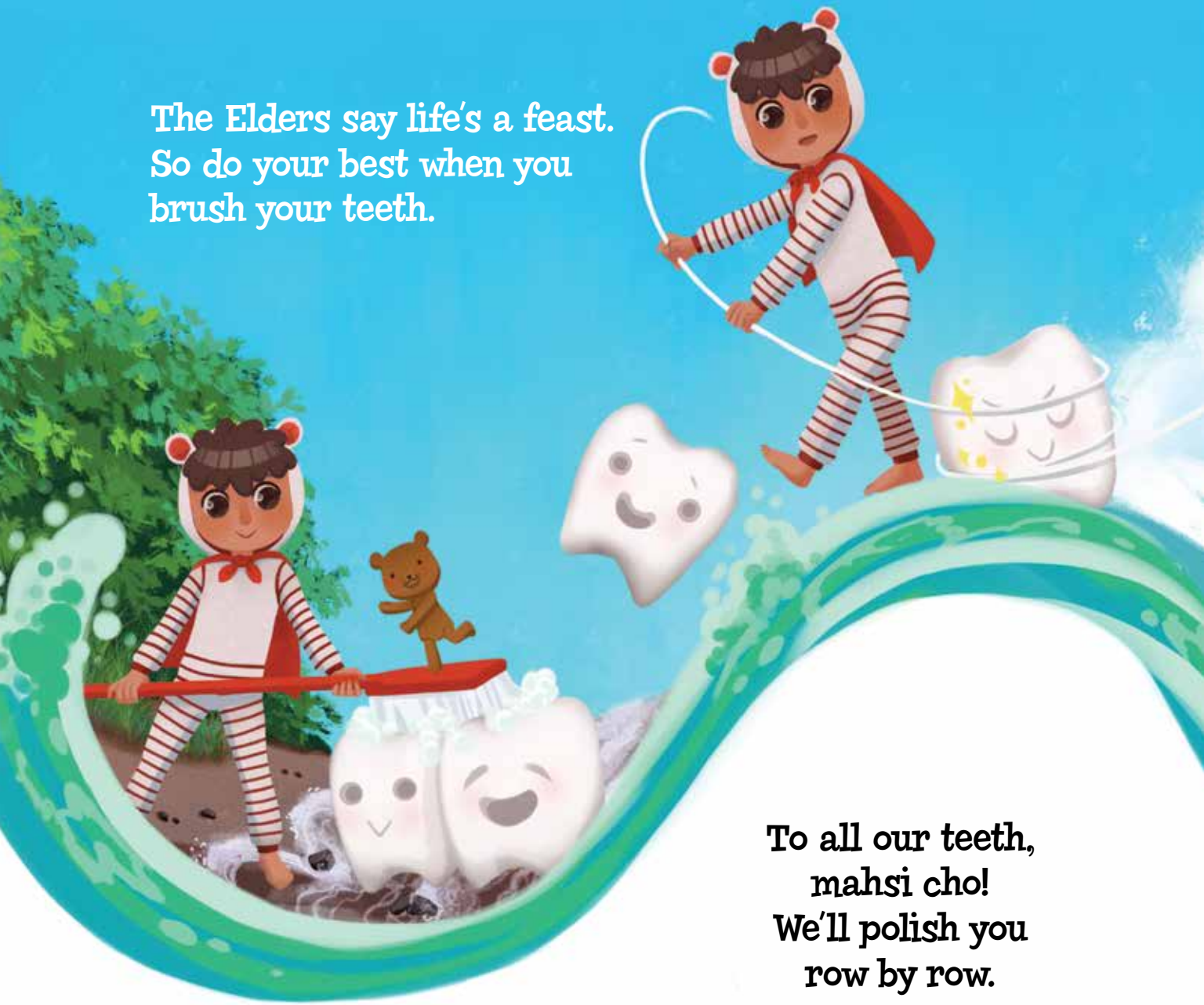

Hum the song:

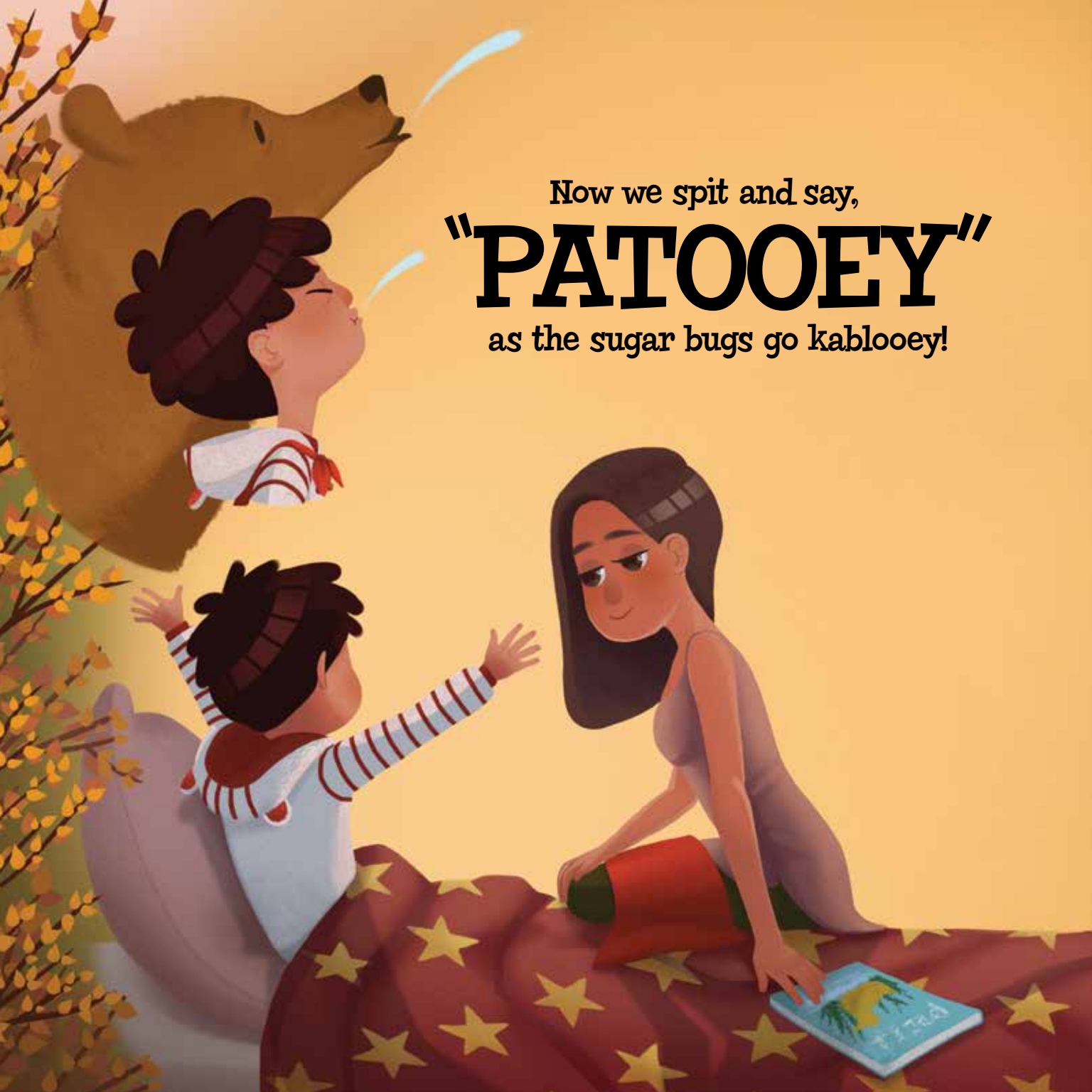
The Elders say

row by row.


